VOCATIONS

Our Council is supporting Jackson Miller through Supreme's Refund Support for Vocations Program.

In the October issue of the "Knightline", noted that Archdiocese of Dubuque seminarians Jackson Miller, Steven Kessler, and Matthew Smith were admitted to Candidacy for Holy Orders on Wednesday, August 30, at Mundelein Seminary.

"To be formally admitted as a Candidate for Holy Orders, a seminarian has developed a relationship with Jesus as a disciple who follows the Lord, listens to His word, and puts the word into practice," said Fr. Mark Murphy, Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese of Dubuque.

"He gives evidence of striving for a life of virtue, of prayer, and of human qualities that will be beneficial to him, and to God's people, as a priest. As it takes time to be formed as a disciple of Jesus with the intention of priesthood, a seminarian is formally admitted as a Candidate for Holy Orders after several years in seminary formation. He will then have several more years of formation until he is ordained a priest."

Below, I share Jackson's Reflection regarding his experience of the ceremony and its significance for him.

REFLECTION OF JACKSON MILLER ON HIS CANDIDACY TO HOLY ORDERS

It was on me to kick off the process of admission by writing a formal letter to Bishop Pates requesting to be admitted to candidacy. I was grateful to express in handwriting that I freely wish to serve the people of God in Dubuque as a priest and that I resolve to guard and foster my vocation in preparation for priestly life. In the week before the ceremony, my classmates and I were on a silent retreat and were especially encouraged to pray about the resolutions we were going to make in a week. This time of reflection enabled me to make a firm and emphatic "Yes!" in front of the Church during the rite of admission. Since the Mass, it has been wonderful to know that the Church has received my resolve and is calling me to continue in formation for the priesthood!

ORDER TO HELP UKRAINIANS

Knights of Columbus around the world are called to respond to their neighbors' needs, by assisting refugees of war and providing relief to those affected by natural disasters.

THE HOLY FAMILY'S REFLECTION OF FAITH AND TRUST

On December 31, the Church celebrates *The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph*. The Gospel of Luke from the Mass describes the Presentation of Jesus in the temple, 40 days after his birth. Mary and Joseph, being a righteous couple, desiring to follow God's law and to honor Him, journey to Jerusalem to present Jesus to the temple priest and offer the requisite sacrifice for Mary's purification.

The prophets foretold the birth of Jesus as the salvation of the world (the name of Jesus means 'Savior'). He came in the image of God, the Word made flesh to save us. In an act reflective of his faith and filled with the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; immediately recognized Jesus and took the child from the arms of his mother Mary. He "blessed God"; proclaiming his eyes have now seen the Salvation...a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for the people of Israel. (ref. Luk 2:32) Salvation begins with God. St John wrote: "In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might have life through him. And through this love, God sent his Son as expiation for our sins" (1 Jn 4:9-10)

Simeon prophesied how Jesus was "destined for the fall and rise of Israel" (Lk 2:34). He told Mary: "you yourself a sword will pierce" (Lk 2:35); alluding to Jesus' suffering and dying on the cross. Certainly, this prophecy was difficult for Mary, a teenage mother to comprehend. Reflecting (recall how Mary pondered) on the trials and tribulations she eventually endures, can help us to approach God in faith and trust, as Mary did. With trust in God and the strength of our faith, we are able to cope when our own lives become challenging.

Faith is an attitude of trust in the presence of God. Faith is being open, inviting God to reveal His providential plan. With God who is the infinite, all-powerful person, we are not in control. One of the most fundamental tenets of faith is that our lives are not about us. Rather, we are part of God's great design (Bishop Robert Barron). Through His grace, God prepares and equips us for the mission he calls us to.

Part of that mission, as Knights of Columbus, parents, and grandparents is that we are the first teachers of the faith, to instill the Catholic faith in our families and especially in our children and grandchildren. In part, through prayer (such as praying the rosary with the family) and attending Sunday Mass as a family we build and form our faith. The family of faith chooses to live contrary to the secular world which is increasingly hostile to faith and the family. St. Joseph, Mary and Jesus are powerful intercessors for marriages and families. Pray to them as a family.
